I am additionally concerned about the emerging gender gap with regards to government investment in Innovation in South Australia. Spaces like Lot 14 are measured against growth metrics which disadvantage / exclude social enterprises and thereby disadvantage / exclude many female founders and entrepreneurs (who typically pursue social enterprise and/or are less likely to be supported in currently male-dominated Tech / Defence / Space industry pathways).
